This MSc has been designed by senior clinicians at Cheshire and Wirral Partnership and the University of Chester. The programme has two entry routes: one for home students working in mental health settings, and an international route for experienced postgraduate psychiatrists who are attached to a full-time NHS post.

This programme will provide you with a speciality Master's qualification while studying alongside interdisciplinary professionals. Home student applicants must be registered health/allied to health professionals, and work in settings with individuals who have mental health issues.

This part time programme is a unique blend of academic learning and subspecialty, clinically applicable training. Think of the MSc in three distinct parts to gain 180 Master's-level credits for your MSc in Psychiatry:

- 1. The two clinical research components (60 credits) are *Critical Appraisal* and the *Research Proposal* module, both of which are based on the principles of 'Good Clinical Practice'. You will focus on the critical appraisal of research evidence to develop advanced evidence-based practice skills. The second module will guide you through the crucial stages of developing a research proposal to enable a rigorous plan of enquiry.
- 2. Clinical modules (60 credits): The three clinical modules focus on mental health law and ethics, subspecialty module, and therapeutic interventions that underpin the delivery of care and treatment in your chosen speciality.
- 3. A dissertation (60 credits): A 12,000-word thesis. This is a significant piece of investigative enquiry from conceptualisation through to completion. Within this final module, 'research' is interpreted as including empirical research involving qualitative and/or quantitative methods, service evaluation, clinical audit, systematic review or a negotiated investigative enquiry unique to your specialism. You will be supervised by a clinician and an academic to complete this work.

Home Student Applicants

Must be a registered health, social care or allied health professional.

Must be working in a mental health environment/setting.

We strongly encourage informal discussions with the Programme Leader before you apply to the programme.

We expect that you will commit to:

- Academic and clinical skills development
- Complete an agreed period of study and training of between two and three years
